About TAABAR

In 2006, an initiative was launched with the aim of extending support to children who found themselves residing in railway stations. This encompassed providing them with shelter, imparting awareness about HIV/AIDS, and offering treatment for STIs. The initial phase commenced with the rental of a temporary flat, accommodating five children initially, with subsequent gradual increments in their numbers. At the outset, constrained by limited resources, our efforts primarily encompassed furnishing meals, along with a few hours of educational and recreational activities. Regrettably, due to our inability to furnish overnight accommodations, a heavy heart accompanied the instances when we had to send the children back to the station for the night. This posed the risk of their susceptibility to unfavorable influences such as prostitution, drug addiction, and trafficking – scenarios that sadly tend to materialize. Subsequently, we engaged with the government and the Jaipur Municipal Corporation, who, having observed our commendable work, allocated a hall in close proximity to the Jaipur railway station. This space, now known as the "Bal Basera" shelter home, serves as a sanctuary for immediate lodging for these vulnerable children, alongside provisioning their fundamental life necessities. The overarching goal is to afford them the prospects essential for wholesome growth and development.

7. *To foster public awareness regarding the challenges and requirements of children in distress.*

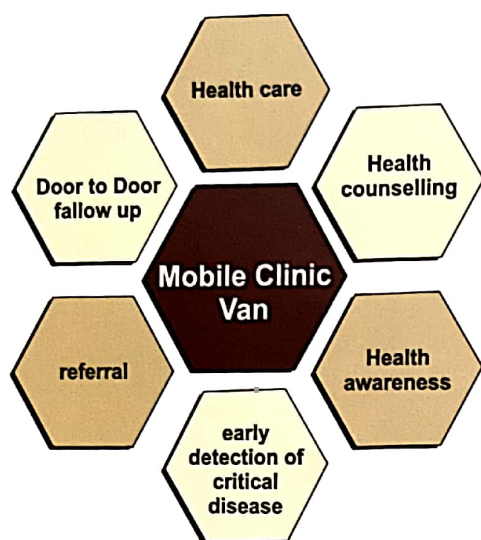

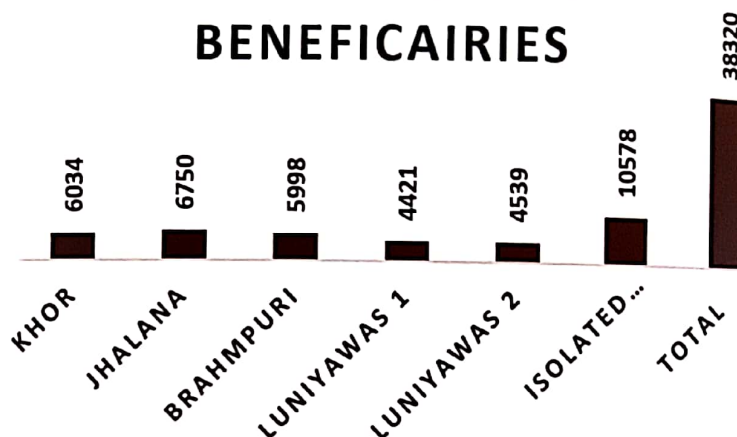


Mobile Clinic Van

Taabar mobile clinic van is an innovative model of healthcare delivery that is alleviating health disparities in vulnerable populations and individuals with chronic diseases. Mobile clinic van is particularly impactful in the following contexts:

Key Highlights

- Well-equipped mobile clinic van provides preventive, curative healthcare services to residents of 10 urban slums of Jaipur.
- The mobile clinic van visits 8 main slums of the Jaipur district, namely Jhalana, Khor, Kagdiwada (Brahm puri), Luniyawas, Sapera Basti, Bagariya Basti, Banjara Basti, Shikariyo ki Dhani once every week.
- Health awareness plays a key role in our approach to improving access to healthcare. We seek to empower communities, medical professionals and patients with appropriate tools, information and skills so that they can make high quality, informed decisions on prevention, diagnosis, treatment, care, and support.
- Awareness programmes covered a wide range of topics, ranging from specific disease to important issues like nutritious diet, health and hygiene, reproductive health in women, menstrual hygiene, counselling programmes and door-to-door visits.

Mobile Clinic Van for Girls and Women

The disparity in accessing healthcare for women and girls is a pressing concern rooted in multifaceted challenges. Girls and women residing in slum areas encounter a complex web of obstacles when seeking healthcare services. These impediments stem from a blend of social, economic, cultural, and infrastructural factors, which manifest in financial constraints, gender inequality, and lack of awareness. Furthermore, the absence of nearby healthcare facilities in slum areas necessitates arduous and costly journeys for women and girls to access medical care, exacerbating the problem. To address these issues comprehensively, TAABAR operates a Mobile Clinic Van with a holistic strategy.

This initiative aims to improve healthcare availability and accessibility, eliminate financial barriers through free programs, raise awareness through campaigns to inform women and girls about available services and their rights, and educate healthcare providers (Mobile Clinic Team) about cultural sensitivity.

Impact

- 15358 beneficiaries including girls and women of marginalized communities received the healthcare services of mobile clinic van for women
- 7410 beneficiaries received the counselling services of mobile clinic van for women. Girls and women discussed about various gynaecological issues, diseases, causes, symptoms and treatment through One to one and group counselling sessions
- Mobile clinic van raised health awareness especially about gynaecological health issues including Breast Cancer, STI, Menstrual Hygiene, Reproductive Health, Maternal Health, Anaemia, Urinary Tract Infection and White Discharge among girls and women of marginalised communities
- Provided free medicines to women and girls after the medical consultation with doctor
- Mobile clinic van team distributed sanitary napkins to girls and women. Distribution of sanitary napkins increased the uses of sanitary napkins among girls and women during the menstrual period and improved their level of hygiene
- Mobile clinic van provided the healthcare services at their door step and reduced the gap between healthcare services and community
- We prepared girls to welcome their periods through awareness session in schools and community



Health Care Center

Health Care Centers for Underprivileged Children, which aims to create a secure and nurturing environment for children from economically challenged families. The approach of these healthcare centers comprises five crucial components focusing on child development, healthy growth, a safe environment, parental involvement, and community engagement.

TAABAR currently operates five healthcare centers that provide comprehensive services addressing these components, including early childhood education, nutritious meals, healthcare and hygiene, emotional and social support, parental involvement, and education and awareness. The Health Care Centers are being operated in Khor Slum, Kagdiwara Slum, Jhalana Slum, Luniyawas First and Second.



Impact

Currently, approximately 1,400 children benefit from the Day cum Health Care Centers. These centers are operational in five locations within the slums of Jaipur city, specifically in Khor, Kagdiwada, and Jhalana, as well as two in the nearby Luniyawas village.

Isolated Communities

TAABAR operates three Health Care Centers for disadvantaged children in the following locations:

- Sanpero Ki Dhani
- Bagariya Basti
- Banjara Basti

We address these children's essential needs through a range of services, including:

1. Education
2. Health and hygiene education
3. Arts and crafts, theater, and recreational activities
4. Counseling services
5. Access to safe drinking water

Impact

1. Improved health and hygiene levels due to regular health check-ups and nutritional supplements, leading to healthier children
2. Increased positive engagement among the children, who have developed a love for activities such as drawing, storytelling, theater, and reciting poems
3. Prevention of 200 children from becoming part of street life
4. Enhanced social acceptance, as these children were previously excluded from mainstream school education due to their unhygienic conditions and traditional attire
5. Positive changes in attitude and behavior observed among mainstream school teachers
6. Improved psychosocial support leading to better behavior and attitude. The children are now willing to support the construction of a school building in their community, and discussions with local representatives are underway
7. Awareness sessions on social issues such as alcohol abuse, domestic violence, child marriage, and girl child education have transformed their traditional beliefs, resulting in increased school enrollment
8. Increased awareness of health issues, including menstrual hygiene, UTIs/STIs, and breast cancer
9. Street plays have played a pivotal role in shifting their mindset and preparing the children to become agents of change
10. Ongoing capacity building on various issues has enhanced their understanding of their real problems and how to address them
11. Regular supply of clean drinking water in communities has improved overall health and survival rates

Mobile Library Van



- Many nomadic tribes and traditional castes (e.g., Snake Charmers, Banjaras, Nats) live in harsh conditions, isolated and deprived of their rights.
- Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan, hosts a significant number of migrants from across the country facing challenges in settling down.



- TAABAR's mission is to integrate these communities into mainstream society, with a focus on educating their children through a Mobile Library Van program that visits eight locations weekly.
- A dedicated teacher accompanies the mobile library, teaching fundamental academic concepts and assessing each child's academic level to create a personalized plan.
- The mobile library goes beyond books, offering activities like storytelling competitions, life skills training, games, art and craft sessions, theater, and festive celebrations.
- The Mobile Library Van not only addresses the educational needs of children but also supports youths who lack resources to purchase expensive books for further studies and job competition.



Women Training Center

TAABAR realized that Empowering woman is essential to the health and social development of families, communities and countries. When women are living safe, fulfilled and productive lives, they can reach their full potential. contributing their skills to the workforce and can raise happier and healthier children. Since the commencement of women training center more than 2000 women have received skill training. Gradually we understood other issues and started to talk on their social, economic, health issues.

Bal Basera Open Shelter Home

From 2006 through the year 2022, a total of 4,761 children from various backgrounds, including runaways, missing children, street children, beggars, and child laborers, have been accommodated. Among this group, 3,290 children have been successfully reunited with their families, while 1,461 have been either repatriated, transferred, or placed in long-term care. At the end of this fiscal year there were 49 children continue to reside at the Bal Basera Open Shelter Home. The Bal Basera Open Shelter Home provides a range of notable features to individuals brought from diverse circumstances who reside within the shelter home.

Impact

Children received a variety of services, experienced enjoyment, acquired knowledge, and were eventually reunited with their families as following

- Informal education that incorporates cutting-edge educational technology, teaching techniques, theater, dance, drama, and music
- Positive engagement through various recreational, skill building, art and craft trainings and personality development programs
- Psychosocial support to the children
- Ensuring access to food and nutritional support
- Providing essential medical treatment
- Implementation of tracking and tracing procedures to locate the children and facilitate their reunification with their families
- Offering family counseling services and maintaining a system of follow-up procedures.
- Open Air gym installed in the park for children
- A variety of amusement equipment was set up in the park.

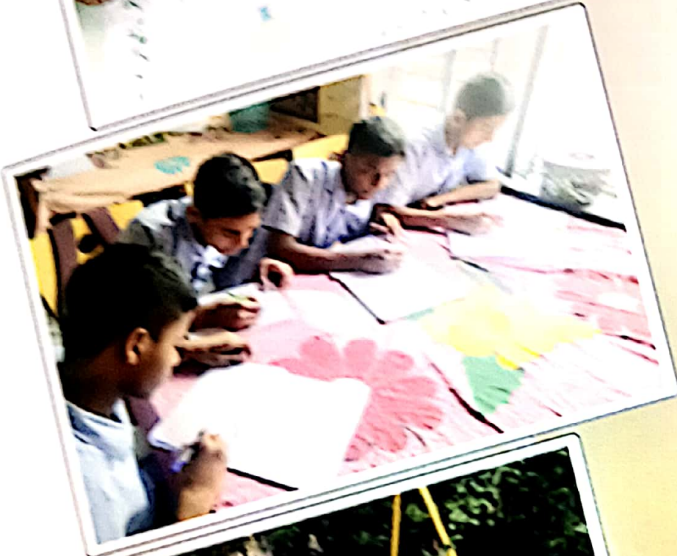

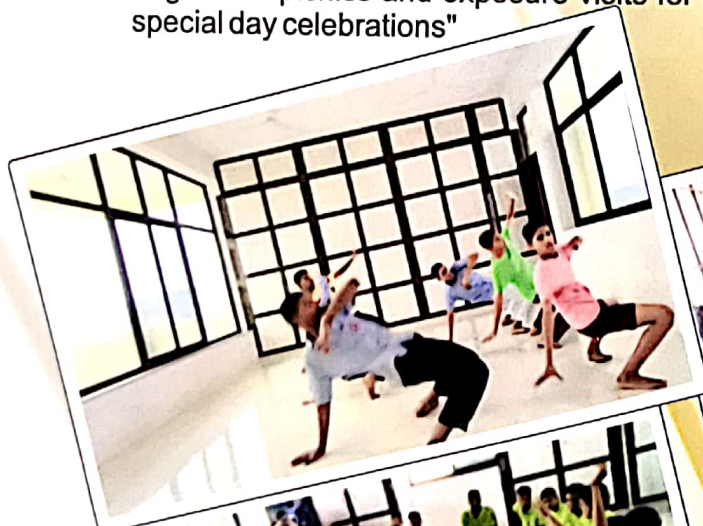
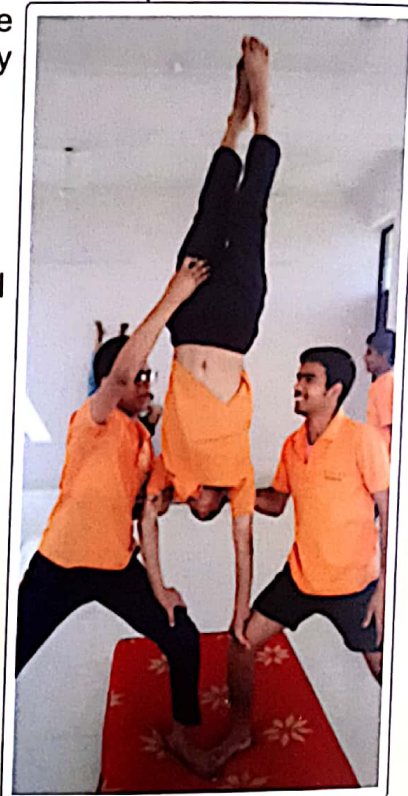
Bal Basera Children Home

"In Jaipur, there is a diverse group of children falling under the purview of the Juvenile Justice Act. This includes children with various backgrounds, such as those with incarcerated parents, children of beggars, homeless youth, orphans, kids from single-parent households, and those whose parents are unable to care for them due to factors like unemployment, disability, terminal illnesses like HIV/AIDS, and even children who are missing and cannot be located.

Since 2015, TAABAR has been running a long-term children's home to provide comprehensive care and support for these children until they reach the age of 18. At present, there are 21 children residing in this home, where they are nurtured in a homely atmosphere.

The children in our care receive a range of services, including:

1. Nutritious food and proper nutrition
2. Toiletries and bedding for their comfort
3. Engaging activities like arts and crafts, as well as recreational activities
4. Informal educational sessions for those in short-term care
5. Educational support for long-term care residents
6. Vocational courses to empower care leavers and other long-term residents, enabling them to lead dignified lives after leaving the institution
7. Arts-based therapy interventions
8. Theatre and Forum Theatre
9. Restoration services
10. Organized picnics and exposure visits for the children, along with special day celebrations"



Psycho Social Support

TAABAR provides psycho-social support to child laborers in three stages:

- **Immediate Rescue Stage:**

1. Children brought to the child-friendly center at Shastri Nagar Police station.
2. Basic needs like food, water, and clothing are provided.
3. Psycho-social first aid offered to help children relax and build trust with the police and rescue team.
4. Children are assured of their safety.
5. Counselors use various activities to encourage children to share their experiences and truths.

- **Post-Rescue Healing Stage (CCI Admission):**

1. Activities and counseling to address trauma from trafficking, rescue, and legal processes.
2. Preparing children for the transitional judicial system.

- **Testimony and Long-Term Support Stage:**

1. Direct support and counseling before, during, and after statement-taking and testimony.
2. Establishing long-term support systems.
3. Creating a protective environment for children.

- **Importance of Psycho-Social Support:**

1. Vital for gathering accurate information and evidence for strong FIRs.
2. Enhances the chances of convictions, as cases often result in acquittals due to insufficient information, weak investigations, and poorly documented FIRs.
3. Counteracts the fear and manipulation child laborers may experience, reducing the likelihood of false or incorrect information being provided.

Impact Stories-I

"From Despair to Recovery: Raghuveer's Inspiring Journey"

In Sumel Kachhi Basti, nestled near Kanota, approximately 40-45 huts line the road, constructed with wooden poles for hanging clothes. Unfortunately, this settlement is plagued by snakes and scorpions, home to about 200 residents.

One day, Raghuveer, a young boy, approached Taabar's secretary, seeking help for a year-long, stubborn wound on his sitting area, oozing pus and emitting a foul odor. Despite his parents' absence due to work, the medical team swiftly cleaned and dressed the wound, providing care instructions. Though his pain subsided, the pus persisted. High sugar levels were initially thought to hinder healing, but an HbA1c test revealed otherwise.

Raghuveer had unknowingly consumed excessive sweet tea at a clan wedding, elevating his sugar levels. A pus culture test pinpointed an *Escherichia coli* infection, prompting a change in treatment. Despite Raghuveer's occasional absences, his wound improved, ultimately sparing him from potential amputation.

As days passed, the wound healed completely, and word spread, drawing more residents to seek medical aid. Raghuveer's grateful parents, unable to offer more than blessings, witnessed their son's miraculous recovery, thanks to timely medical intervention.

"Yogita's Path to Well-being: A Holistic Approach"

Yogita is a 5th-grade student living with her family – mom, dad, and two sisters. Her dad is a daily wage laborer, and their income is unsteady. Her mom, a skilled tailor, works from home, sewing clothes for girls and women. Their neighbors and relatives, however, lack formal education and struggle with daily alcohol consumption.

One day, a teacher from a local center reached out to Yogita's mom and introduced her to the health center's services. Yogita joined the center, where she embraced educational and creative activities for years. She excelled in art & craft, dance, and theater and enthusiastically joined festival celebrations. With dedicated teachers' support, her academics thrived.

Yogita also gets healthcare and counseling from a mobile clinic van, ensuring her good health. Regular check-ups keep her safe, and health awareness sessions boost her knowledge about diseases, symptoms, and prevention. This knowledge helps her tackle issues like dengue, malaria, allergies, skin problems, dental health, and eye care.

Yogita's story shows how education, health, and community support can brighten lives, even in the face of economic challenges.

"Shiwani's Journey: Education, Health, and a Heartwarming Rescue"

Shiwani, a 12-year-old in the 6th grade, lives with her family in Jaipur. Her dad works as a laborer, and her mom is a housemaid. They moved here for better work opportunities but faced tough times when her dad got injured.

A teacher's visit brought hope. Shiwani started getting educational support and excelled in her studies.

During a clinic visit, Shiwani got a medical test prescribed. The teacher helped her family with it. Results showed heart issues. Urgently, she was sent to a hospital for tests and treatment.

The teacher's support made it happen. They found the problem early, thanks to regular check-ups. Today, Shiwani and her family are on the path to better health and brighter futures, thanks to education and healthcare.

Post Rescue and Rehabilitation of Child Laborers



The comprehensive post-rescue rehabilitation of rescued child laborers encompasses a multifaceted approach. Initially, it addresses their immediate basic needs, encompassing provisions such as food, shelter, clothing, bedding, and toiletries. Simultaneously, there is a focus on providing essential psycho-social support to help them cope with their traumatic experiences.



Legal procedures, including recording their statements, establishing bank accounts, and obtaining Aadhar cards, are initiated to safeguard their rights and identities. The process also involves assembling files for victim compensation claims, ensuring thorough medical check-ups, and providing necessary care and treatment. In tandem, efforts are directed towards their holistic development, encompassing nutrition and education. Positive engagement forms a crucial element of their rehabilitation, which includes informal education, recreational activities, artistic pursuits like theater and dance training, computer classes, and arts-based therapy sessions. Additionally, organized picnics, exposure visits, and celebratory occasions like birthdays contribute to their emotional well-being. For children who were missing, ran away, or faced difficult circumstances, the rehabilitation process seeks to restore their sense of security and stability. This involves coordination with various agencies such as Child Welfare Committees, District Child Protection Units, the Railway authorities, and Bihar DCPU, with the ultimate goal of reunification with their families or suitable alternatives, followed by diligent follow-up to ensure their continued well-being. The process also encompasses home verification and meticulous digital case file preparation, underscoring the commitment to the child's welfare at every step.

"Rahul's Journey: From Hardship to Hope"

Rahul's life was closely tied to his parents' struggles as daily wage laborers at a brick kiln. Things took a dark turn when a greedy agent arrived in their village, looking to exploit children for labor. Rahul's parents reluctantly agreed to send his elder brother to work in a bangle making unit for a small advance payment.

But the agent returned, this time targeting Rahul. He took Rahul to a bangle making unit in Jaipur, where Rahul worked long hours from 10AM to 11 PM daily. The tough work meant skipping meals and not getting enough food. Despite promises, the agent didn't pay Rahul's mother.

Hope emerged when local law enforcement rescued Rahul and other children from the bangle making unit on 07/1/2023. Rahul and his friends were cared for by the Child Welfare Committee and found shelter at Bal Basera.

They had thorough medical check-ups to ensure their health and safety. The teachers at Bal Basera introduced Rahul to various activities, including healthcare, counseling, education, and creative pursuits like theater, dance, music, and art & craft.

Rahul's journey toward empowerment started as he enthusiastically joined these activities. He not only learned to read and write in Hindi and English but also enjoyed art. Good meals at Bal Basera kept him strong, while theater classes boosted his confidence.

After a few months, Rahul reunited with his family in Bihar, thanks to the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) and Bal Basera staff. Today, he lives with his family, and Bal Basera continues to support him. Regular check-ins ensure his well-being, offering help when needed. This marks the end of one chapter and the start of a brighter, more hopeful future for Rahul.

"Khushi's Triumph: Beating Jaundice with Mobile Clinic Care"

In a bustling community, the mobile clinic van tirelessly served its residents, providing essential healthcare. During one visit, 10-year-old Khushi sought medical help. Khushi lived with her family, and her dad, an E-Rickshaw driver, struggled due to his habit of spending earnings on alcohol. Her mom worked as a school cleaner, using her income for Khushi's education.

Khushi warmly registered at the clinic and met the doctor. She shared her health concerns openly. The doctor diagnosed her with Jaundice, advising light meals. Despite her mom's efforts with home remedies, Khushi's condition hadn't improved.

Khushi and her mom joined a counseling session by the mobile clinic team to learn about Jaundice symptoms, treatment, and precautions. Empowered with knowledge, Khushi received a ten-day supply of medicines. She diligently followed the doctor's advice, taking her medications. Over time, she felt better and stronger.

The doctor extended her prescription for five more days, suggesting sugarcane juice and coconut water for faster recovery. Khushi embraced these suggestions and continued to make remarkable progress.

With gratitude, Khushi returned to the mobile clinic van after completing her treatment. She thanked the team for their unwavering support, which helped her conquer Jaundice. Khushi's story shows how accessible healthcare brings not only treatment but also hope to those in need in her community.
